

PROFILE OF PROFESSOR AMOS OYESOJI AREMU

Amos Oyesoji was born on 27 March, 1964 in the city of Abidjan, Ivory Coast. Amos Oyesoji Aremu whose first language as a child was French was enrolled at Baptist Day School (Ecole Primaire Baptiste), Ajame, Ivory Coast in 1971 for his primary education. He was in the school till June, 1975 when he was brought to Nigeria with two of his siblings by his father. He subsequently attended Baptist Modern School, Ola between 1975 and 1978. After obtaining his Modern School Certificate, Amos Oyesoji Aremu travelled to Ivory Coast and became the youngest teacher ever at the age of 14 in his Alma mater, Baptist Day School, Adjame. Amos Oyesoji Aremu returned to Nigeria in 1979 and got admitted into Form II at Baptist High School, Iwo between 1979 and 1983. He completed his secondary education in June 1983 by making all his papers at one seating. He had his Higher School Certificate also at Baptist High School, Iwo between 1983 and 1985 and graduated with 10 Advanced level points. He was admitted to the University of Ibadan in 1985 to study Guidance and Counselling in the Faculty of Education and graduated with honours in 1988. After his one-year national service at the Juvenile Unit, Ministry of Social Development, Youth and Sports, Kwara State, Oyesoji Aremu returned to the University of Ibadan for his Master's Degree in Counselling Psychology and graduated in 1990 with a Ph.D grade and ahead of his class. He commenced his Ph.D in 1992 and defended his thesis on the 22nd December, 1997 as a part-time student while working as a School Counsellor in Oyo and Osun states.

Professor Oyesoji Aremu joined the Department of Guidance and Counselling, University of Ibadan, on the 11th of November, 1998 as a Lecturer Grade II. He was promoted to the position of Lecturer Grade I in 2002, Senior Lecturer in 2005, Reader in 2008 and Professor in 2011.

Professor Oyesoji Aremu won several academic laurels in and outside Nigeria. They are as follows:
